Baphalane Primary School renovation

Baphalane Traditional Council, together with Dikuno Trust (from Anglo American) have put in motion plans to renovate Baphalane Primary school. the school project is aimed at upliftment of the general aesthetics and classroom upliftment.

Anglo American previous intentions did not proceed as planned, however recent engagements between Dikuno Trust and Baphalane Traditional Council members have paved way for renovatin of the school to begin.

FIRST PHASE

National Treasury has issued NOTICE ON THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT JUDGMENT REGARDING PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, 2017 being regarded as invalid.

This comes after the constitutional court judgement on the Minister of Finance v Aribusiness NPC [2022] ZACC 4. National Treasury further advised government department amongst others that:

- Tenders advertised before 16 February 2022 be finalised in terms of the 2017 Regulations;
- Tenders advertised on or after 16 February 2022 be held in abeyance; and
- No new tenders be advertised (available on NT's website).

Baphalane Road Infrastructure project in partnership with the Government of North West has since being put on hold until way forward is provided by National Treasury.



BTC EFFORTS

The Council is hard at work, with strategic merger of Infrastructure development programme including projects like Dikuno tsa Setchaba Trust, Northam and Anglo American. Projects from these entities includes Clinic, Tar road, Baphalane primary development.

The Council continues to look for ways in which collaboration with Mines may result in Job-Creation, Skills development and support for SMME's. This has a time limit attached to, with a plan and commitment from partners to be concluded.

In the back of National Treasury Regulations invalidity, Baphalane Traditional Council has taken resolution to continue road maintenance until the court case clarity has been provided to National Government Department.

Grater will be made available for maintenance of roads earmarked for tar road construction from Baphalane Traditional Council coffers.
